David Andruss studied piano and pedagogy at the University of Southern California in Los Angeles (Bachelor of Music) and with Donald Walker at Northern Illinois University in DeKalb (Master of Music). A Fulbright Scholarship made it possible for him to study for two years in Saarbrücken, Germany, where he intensified his studies of chamber music with Stefan Litwin. Further studies followed in piano with Bernd Glemser in Saarbrücken, where he received his Konzertreife-Diplom, and in Würzburg, where he received the highly acclaimed Meisterklassendiplom.

Among other contests he won the international piano competition of the Young Keyboard Artists Association in California at an early age. In addition, he was twice the winner of the Chicago Chopin Competition.

Andruss is currently active as a concert pianist, as a co-author of a European piano instruction program (Keys4Music), and as a piano teacher trainer throughout Europe. He teaches at the University in Würzburg. His focus as a concert pianist is on lecture recitals, which are very carefully prepared and performed with charme, profound knowledge and wit.
